FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Members and Friends of Curling,

Welcome to the Fall issue of the WRep Sheet. It contains the news from the USWCA 2025 Fall Meeting. Hosted by the Belfast Curling Club, officers, directors, and committee chairs came together from across the country to conduct business, share ideas, and enjoy the fellowship that is at the heart of our organization. In addition, the meeting accomplished significant organizational work: a Regional Realignment, Governance Updates, Bonspiel Planning for the next



several years. For our Tours, the Incoming Friendship Committee began preparations to welcome Canadian curlers to the U.S. in Fall 2028, and The Scot Tour Committee selected 20 women from across the country to represent the U.S. in Scotland in November 2026. The meetings concluded with the Board of Directors Meeting renewing our sense of purpose and enthusiasm for the year ahead. Thank you to all members for their dedication to promoting curling and building lasting friendships on and off the ice.

ANNOUNCING THE 2026 USWCA OUTGOING SCOT TOUR

The United States Women's Curling Association (USWCA) is thrilled to announce the upcoming 2026 USWCA Outgoing Scot Tour. Twenty women, selected from nearly 50 applications received from players at member clubs across the United States, will represent the USWCA in Scotland in 2026.

The tour is much more than competition—it's a celebration of the spirit of curling, sportsmanship, and international friendship. The Scot Tour is part of a long history of exchange between the USWCA and RCCC dating back to 1955. These tours have fostered international goodwill and have become a highlight for women curlers in both countries. The USWCA team visits clubs throughout Scotland, engaging in friendly matches and cultural exchanges, while the Scots reciprocate by touring the United States every ten years.

To ensure fairness and uphold the values of the USWCA, the Outgoing Scot Tour committee adopted a structured, ranked rubric for selection of the women who will hold the 20 coveted tour slots. The rubric assessed curling volunteerism, curling resume, and club evaluations All applicants were required to be USWCA members for at least five years and belong to a club with a minimum three-year USWCA membership.

Teams will depart for Scotland in late October and return mid-November 2026. The US women will enjoy 19 days of curling, touring, and club visits across Scotland.

What's Next: The players have been selected, and teams will be announced soon. Stay tuned for more details as we prepare to send our U.S. curlers to Scotland for this unforgettable experience!

ANOTHER CIRCUIT SEASON UNDERWAY

Our goal is to support women's bonspiels at our member clubs by attracting more teams to them and support women curlers in the Spirit of Curling -- meeting other women curlers, involving newer curlers in the sport, improving skills through friendly competition and awarding cash prizes! All funds collected go back as prize money to the Circuit Curlers, by region. A maximum of your top 3 bonspiels will count toward points. This year we are running a pilot program where only one person on the team needs to be a member of the Circuit in order for you to earn points. We still encourage you to get other members of your team to sign up. We have also adjusted the scoring to be simpler which is posted on the website. Our goal this season is to be able to post the scores as they are reported to us every few weeks throughout the season.

The new season started on May 1, 2025 and will run until April 30, 2026.

KEEP WARM THIS SEASON - WIN A CURLING QUILT



REGIONAL RE-ALIGNMENT APPROVED

The Board of Directors voted at the Fall Meeting in Belfast, Maine, to adjust the regions to which some of its member clubs belong.

The changes are designed to promote more even representation of our member clubs when bonspiel team and Tour membership selections are made, when Standing Committees are formed and when officers are elected. Iowa, Missouri, Arkansas and Louisiana move from Central to Mid States. Wisconsin is added to Mid States. Nebraska, Kansas, Oklahoma, Texas, New Mexico and Colorado move from West to Mid States.

USWCA ARCHIVES MOVE

We are excited to announce our partnership with the Wisconsin Historical Society: Division of Library, Archives, and Museum Collections.

The WHS team collected all of the USWCA materials from their previous home in Past President Star Pfiffner's basement. This included records, scrapbooks, meeting minutes, songbooks, rulebooks, articles of incorporation, bylaws, promotional materials, and other related documents, from 1947 to 2020.

The WHS will be digitizing the materials for preservation and access purposes; materials will be available for research and scholarship. Materials stored at the library are rotated out to the museum for exhibition displays.

We thank Past President Terri Gleason and her Thanksgiving guest (a friend of her son's), who is on the Board of Directors for the Wisconsin Historical Society. We also thank Star for her years of storing the materials in her basement and manually searching for information as requests came in.

The Historical Society is forming displays and filming components for the forthcoming history center, scheduled to open Fall of 2027. They are looking to preserve curling history. 
USWCA GRANTS AT WORK

GIFTS AND GRANTS

The Gifts and Grants Committee continues to financially support curling by women and youth, including Junior Travel Assistance. At the Fall Meeting 2025 in Belfast, Maine, the Board of Directors approved seven requests presented by the Gifts and Grants Committee.

This season's grants were awarded to:

Club representatives please help drive applications for Gifts and Grants for your clubs. It can be for travel for juniors and women, but also for coaching, helping your club be ADA compliant, events that help a broader group etc. USWCA has a special interest in 5 and Under Women's teams attempting to qualify, or who have qualified for Nationals, please look for those teams in your club and encourage them to apply for grants. We are very pleased with the wide variety of requests received this grant cycle.

Applications are reviewed twice per year during the Fall and the Winter meetings. The due date for consideration at the Winter 2026 meeting is 2 weeks prior to the meeting, February 9, 2026. Applicants will be notified of their grant application status following each meeting. Funds will be released when receipts and pictures are received. Applications can be submitted with receipts for an event that has already taken place.
