A COMEBACK FOR 5 & UNDER BONSPIELS

Pending recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic, the USWCA is looking forward to sponsoring 5 & Under Bonspiels in all four regions next season. Because these bonspiels had to be canceled this 2020-21 season, we are calling it the Blank End. Eligibility to curl next season, 2021-22, will be determined by the status of curlers in the 2019-20 season. This is to ensure that no eligible curler is denied the opportunity to curl in our USWCA-sponsored 5 & Under Bonspiels because of the pandemic. The USWCA encourages all new curlers to take advantage of the opportunity to experience curling in a 5 & Under Bonspiel this coming season.

HELP WANTED: PROMOTIONAL SALES


